

## **Grade Classifications**

Novice	One who, at any age, may be racing in any class of boat for the first time
Intermediate	One who, at any age, may elect to advance to Intermediate class, after having won a set number of rowing or sculling races at the Novice level.
Junior	One who is aged not more than 18 years
Senior B	One who is aged not more than 23 years
Senior A	One who is generally no longer able to row Intermediate and is over the age of 23.
School Boy/Girl	Races are classified according to age
Elite	One who trains only for international, national and State events. This classification is open to any competitor who can reach this standard.
Masters	One who reaches 27 in the current year and has not, in that year: (i) competed as an Australian Representative or as a representative of another country in Senior A competition; or (ii) competed as a state/territory representative in senior a competition.

Masters are divided into the following age Categories:

A.	27 – 35 years	F.	60 – 64 years
B.	36 – 42 years	G.	65 – 69 years
C.	43 – 49 years	H.	70 – 74 years
D.	50 – 54 years	I.	75 – 79 years
